E-Safety

As part of our commitment to keeping our students safe online, we want to make you aware of the potential risks associated with pop-up advertisements. These unexpected windows can appear while browsing the internet and may seem harmless, but they can pose significant dangers, especially for young users.

Why Are They Risky?

Malware and Viruses: Some pop-ups can install harmful software on your computer, which can steal personal information or damage your system.

Inappropriate Content: Pop-ups may display content that is not suitable for children, including violent or explicit material.

Phishing Scams: These can trick users into providing personal information, such as passwords or credit card details, by pretending to be legitimate websites.

How to Protect Your Child:

Use Pop-Up Blockers: Ensure that pop-up blockers are enabled on your child's web browser.

Educate and Supervise: Talk to your child about the dangers of clicking on pop-ups and supervise their online activities.

Install Security Software: Keep your computer protected with up-to-date antivirus software.
