### **E-Safety: Deepfake AI**

We would like to raise awareness of the growing use of *deepfake AI* technology and the importance of keeping our children safe online. Deepfakes are images, videos or audio clips that have been digitally altered to make them appear real, even when they are not. While this technology can be used creatively, it also carries risks, particularly when it is used to mislead or imitate others.

We encourage all families to have open conversations with children about what they see online and to remind them that not everything on the internet is genuine. It is important that pupils understand the importance of respecting others, thinking critically about digital content and never sharing or creating content that could harm or upset someone else.

In school, we continue to promote safe and responsible use of technology as part of our curriculum. If your child has any questions or concerns about something they have seen online, please encourage them to speak to a trusted adult at home or school.

Working together, we can ensure our children remain safe, informed and responsible in an ever-changing digital world.
